When Jesus himself went into the synagogue in his home town, Nazareth, we are told that he opened the scroll of the Prophet Isaiah and read the passage: "He has sent me to preach good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the prisoners and recovery of sight to the blind, to liberate the oppressed, and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour."

The person reading would then explain the text and teach its meaning. It was usual that this 'teaching' would last about forty minutes. When Jesus finished reading we are told that, "every eye was upon him" as they eagerly awaited what he would say.

In fact he said one sentence: "Today, this scripture has been fulfilled just as you heard it."

It was the shortest sermon ever preached!

So, if it's good enough for Jesus, why not for me?

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.

You shall love your neighbour as yourself.

Saying anything more only takes from the awesome simplicity and power of these words.

Just Imagine how different our world would be; how different Israel and Palestine would be; how different Ukraine would be; how different my family would be; how different my work place would be; how different I would be, if I could only do it? "Love God. Love your neighbour as yourself."

The overwhelming question is this: Why can't I? Why don't I? or at least, Why don't I try...?

Please remember the sick in our parish....
