Stewardship Reflection

This story provides us with background information to help us understand Jesus's parable in today's Gospel (Matthew 25.1-13). J. Alexander Findlay, Principal of Didsbury Methodist College in Manchester, recounts a captivating experience during his visit to Palestine. Approaching the gates of a Galilean town, he witnessed a lively procession of ten maidens, elegantly dressed and skillfully playing musical instruments, dancing joyfully ahead of their car. Curious, he asked about their purpose, and the interpreter explained that they were accompanying the bride until her bridegroom's arrival. He inquired about the possibility of witnessing the wedding, but the interpreter merely shook his head, conveying the uncertainty of the timing: "It might be tonight, tomorrow night, or a fortnight from now; no one can predict." The interpreter continued, explaining that a cherished tradition at middle-class weddings in Palestine involved catching the bridal party off guard. The bridegroom's arrival was unpredictable, often occurring in the dead of night. While public etiquette dictated that a messenger would announce, "Behold! the bridegroom is coming!" at any moment, the bridal party had to remain vigilant, ready to greet him whenever he chose. Moreover, two key rules prevailed: no one could venture the streets after dark without a lit lamp, and latecomers were barred from the ceremony once the bridegroom had arrived and the doors had been shut.

Jesus tells the parable to impress his followers of the need to live this life as a clear and certain preparation for the future eternal life. It's not enough to desire eternal life; one's life must practically demonstrate preparedness and worthiness for the Kingdom of Heaven. Two universal warnings that are worth heeding: (1) It serves as a reminder that there are certain things that cannot be obtained at the eleventh hour. It's far too late for a student to begin preparing on the day of the exam or to acquire a skill or character when a task demands it. Similarly, procrastination in matters of faith can lead to a situation where we are unprepared to meet with God. (2) The parable also emphasizes that there are certain things that cannot be borrowed. The foolish virgins discovered that they couldn't borrow oil when they realized they needed it. Likewise, we cannot borrow a relationship with God; we must nurture and develop it ourselves. Character cannot be borrowed; it must be

cultivated within us. We can't perpetually rely on the spiritual capital accumulated by others. Some things in life must be won or acquired through our own efforts, as they cannot be borrowed from someone else.

There's a true account that comes from the sinking of the Titanic. A frightened woman found her place in a lifeboat that was about to be lowered into the raging North Atlantic. She suddenly thought of something she needed, so she asked permission to return to her stateroom before they cast off. She was granted three minutes or they would leave without her. She ran across the slanted deck that was already at a dangerous angle. She raced through the gambling room with all the money that had rolled to one side, ankle deep. She came to her stateroom and quickly pushed a side her diamond rings, expensive bracelets, and necklaces as she reached to the shelf above her bed and grabbed three small oranges. She quickly found her way back to the lifeboat and got in. - Now that seems incredible because thirty minutes earlier she would not have chosen a crate of oranges over the smallest diamond. But death had boarded the Titanic. One blast of its awful breath had transformed all values. And in that moment she preferred three small oranges to a crate of diamonds. In the light of her current circumstances, that she must make preparations for living on a lifeboat. Likewise, in this world where Jesus may return at any moment, the parable warns, we must be ready. Are you ready?


STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION
