**Sunday
Reflection
by Fr. Vincent**

The Gospel for Christmas recounts that an angel of the Lord stood before the shepherds and said, “Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger... So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger.” The significance of the baby lying in the manger was profound, as it symbolized that he was the nourishment for the world. The shepherds also hastened to Bethlehem, emphasizing that the only fitting way to seek the Lord is with haste.

They were seeking Jesus the Saviour but they found Mary and Joseph too, who were simply being with their child, much like the first Apostles called “to be with him.” Some forms of Christianity would push aside Mary and Joseph and focus solely on Jesus. This is not Catholic Christianity. Don’t ever be misled by people who say Mary and Joseph “distract” from Jesus or “take away” from him. When we seek Jesus we find him with Mary, and Joseph—the Holy Family.

Jesus came to Earth as a human child within a human family because that’s what God intended. He wanted and needed a family, and he doesn’t expect us to dismiss them. Our Savior’s face is that of a man standing between his parents, and just as Jesus honored his family, he wants us to do the same. If Jesus is our brother, then Mary is our Mother, and Joseph our father. We are all members of “the Family.”

As we gather around the altar, we join Jesus as a family, where he becomes present and feeds us with his Body and Blood. Some Catholics may choose not to attend Mass, claiming, “I want only Jesus – I can pray to him at home.” This is not true Christianity! True Christianity involves being part of Jesus’ family of faith—the Church. Those who want Jesus but not his Church are not fully embracing Christianity.

Fred Craddock tells the story of serving in an area where all the local pastors rotated turns as chaplain at the small, thirty-bed area hospital. During one of his turns, a baby was born. He went to the hospital and encountered

a whole family of folks gathered around the window of the nursery looking at the baby. He met the father who looked sort of worried, anxious, and dumbstruck all at the same time—that “new father” look. The baby’s name was Elizabeth. As they looked at the baby, she started to squirm and scream. The father looked worried, so Dr. Craddock said something about the baby not being sick but just clearing out her lungs like all newborns do. The father said, “Oh, I know she’s not sick. But she’s mad as the devil.” That took Dr. Craddock back a little, and he asked, “Why’s she mad?” The father said, “Well, wouldn’t you be mad? One minute you’re with God in Heaven, and the next minute you’re in Georgia!” Dr. Craddock asked, “You believe she was with God before she came here?” The father said, “Oh, yeah.” Then Craddock asked, “You think she’ll remember?” And he said, “Well, that’s up to her family. It’s up to the Church. We’ve got to ensure that she remembers, because if she forgets, she’s lost.” – Friends, it’s essential to treasure both our biological family and our spiritual family, which is the church, in our lives.
